Sequencing 1: The Stiles Approach to Finding the Key

Course Description

Sequencing is a road map for how to treat the bodyit tells you where in the body to start treatment (and gives you a rationale for why), and then where to advance next, and when to end the treatment.

In this introductory course, you will learn the principles behind sequencing and how to apply them. We will cover eye dominance, how to blend with the tissue while palpating (blending palpation) in order to get the best feedback, how to move the patient utilizing the principles of tensegrity, and how to choose the treatment type. Examinations of each area of the body will be explored.

Additionally, we will learn how to sequence the pelvis utilizing Fred Mitchell, Sr.'s model of pelvic mechanics and tie that in with the rest of the body. Sequencing helps you to make sense of a complicated patient and guides you through their treatment. Sequencing makes each treatment unique for every patient at every visit. The key area is potentially different for every patient at every visit—so you may never treat in the same order or the same way twice. Sequencing makes you EFFECTIVE without learning new techniques every few months.

Course Goals & Objectives

- Make certain the practitioner knows their dominant eye and hand, what it means in relation to the patient and how to utilize it to get more consistent results.
- Introduce the concept of blending palpation, instruct the attendee on how to achieve this type of palpatory experience and use this new skill in assessing the patient.

- Describe and instruct the attendee in how to apply the concepts of tensegrity into their palpation of the patient. Utilize these principles in locating the key lesion.
- Instruct the attendee on how Fred Mitchell, Sr.'s model of the pelvis works and how it fits into sequencing.
- Instruct the attendee in how to apply all of the above objectives into locating the key lesion and then, through treatment of the key lesion, the attendee will be able to check their assessment and begin to self correct their assessment.
