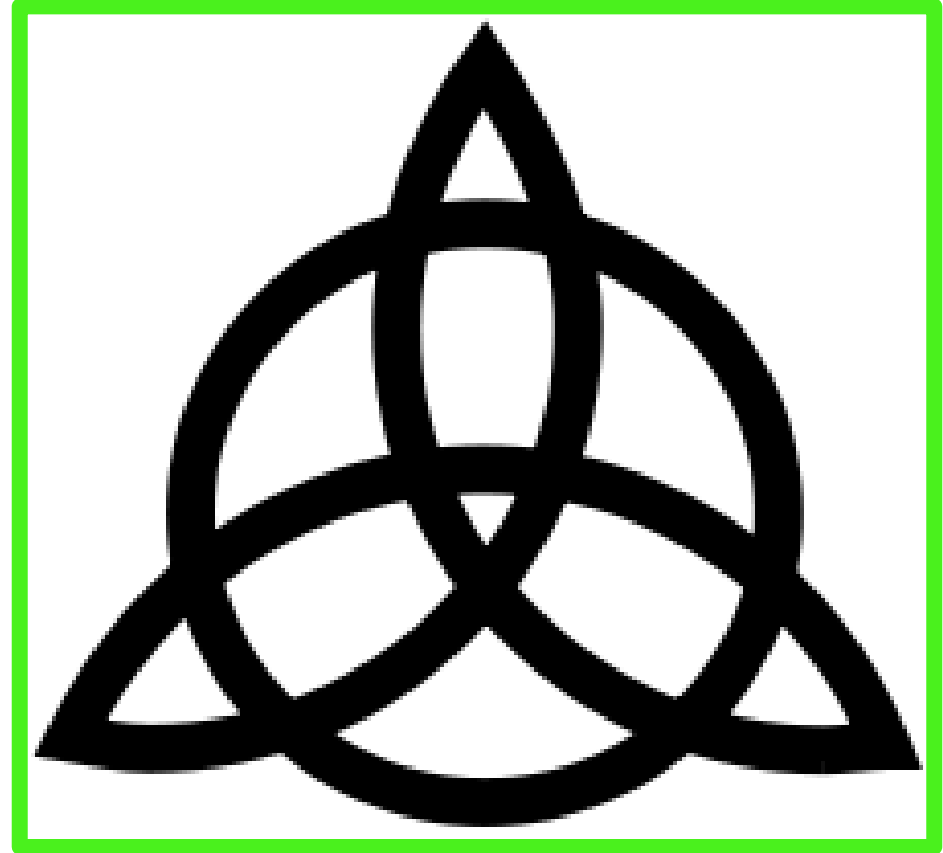
The path is not always a clear choice.

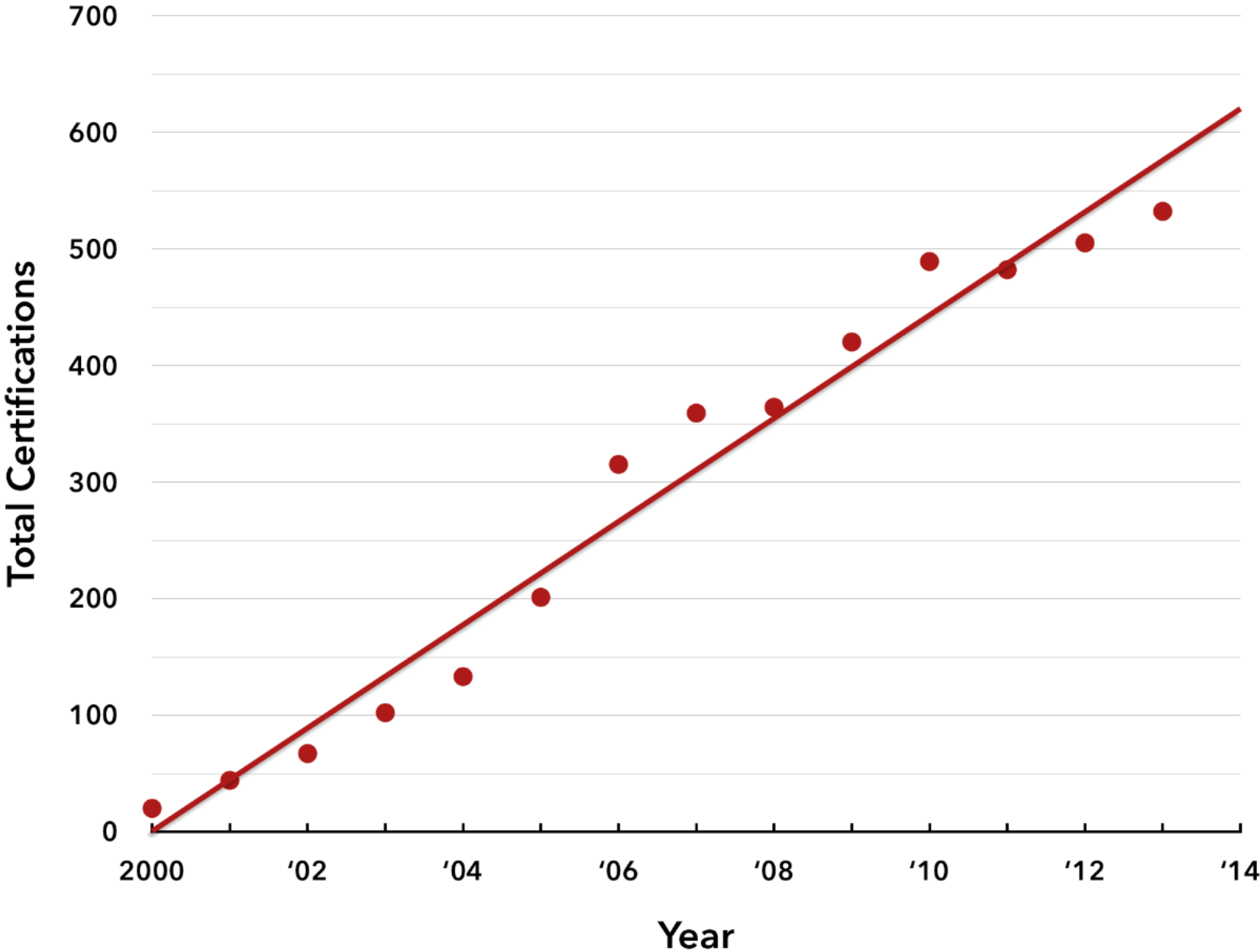

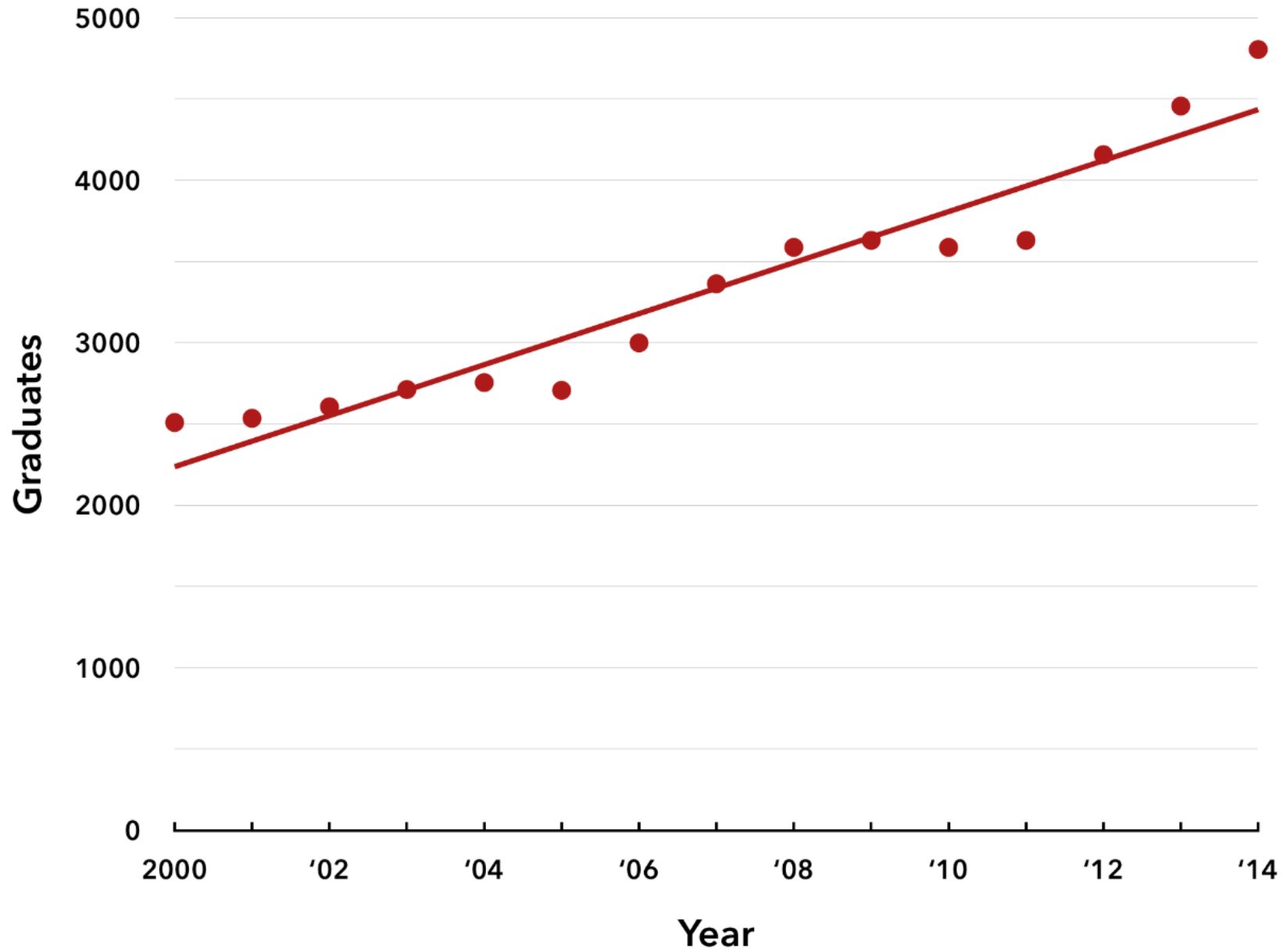
Cumulative AOBNMM Certifications



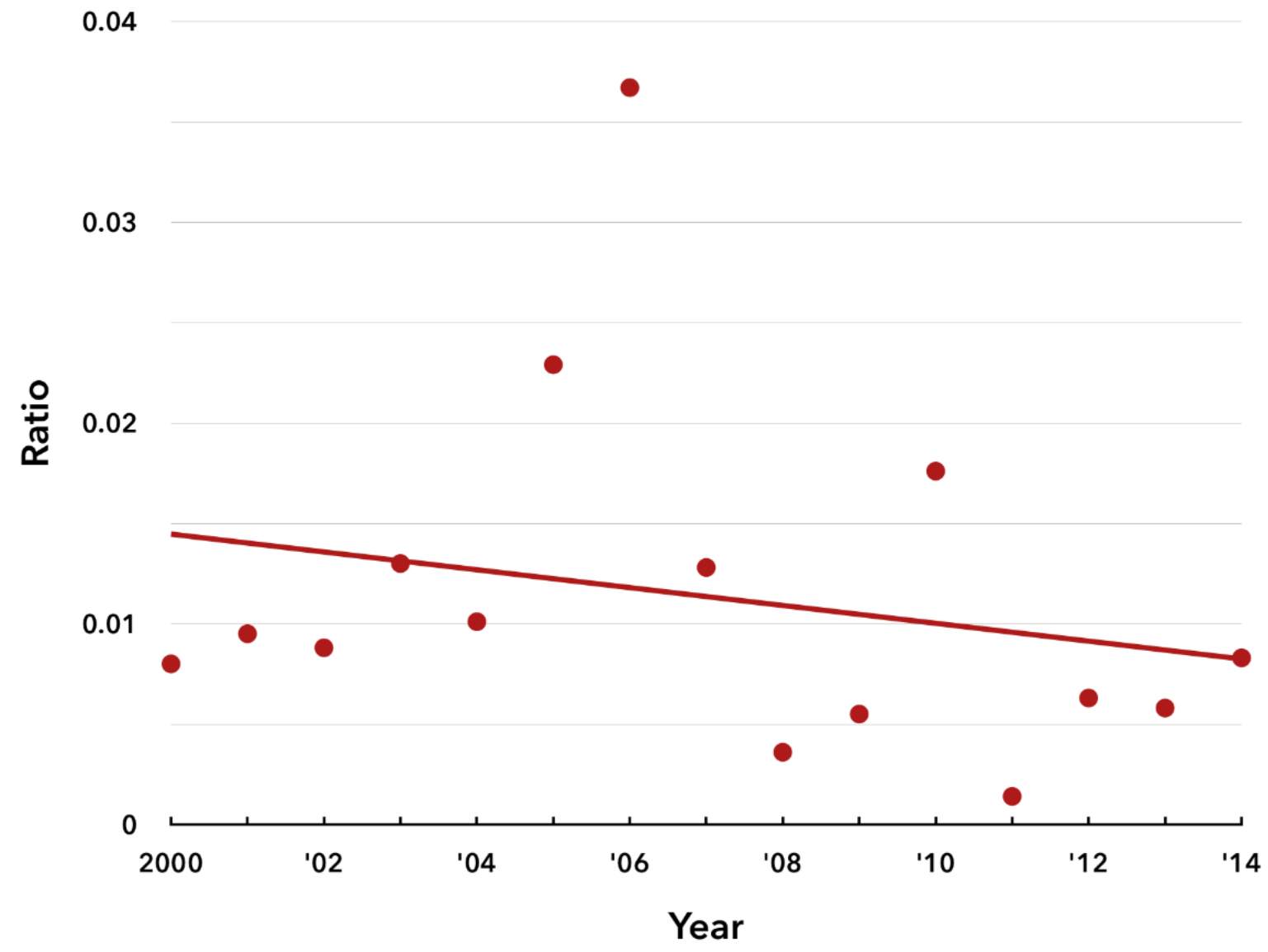
AOBNMM Certifications and Recertifications



Graduates from Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine

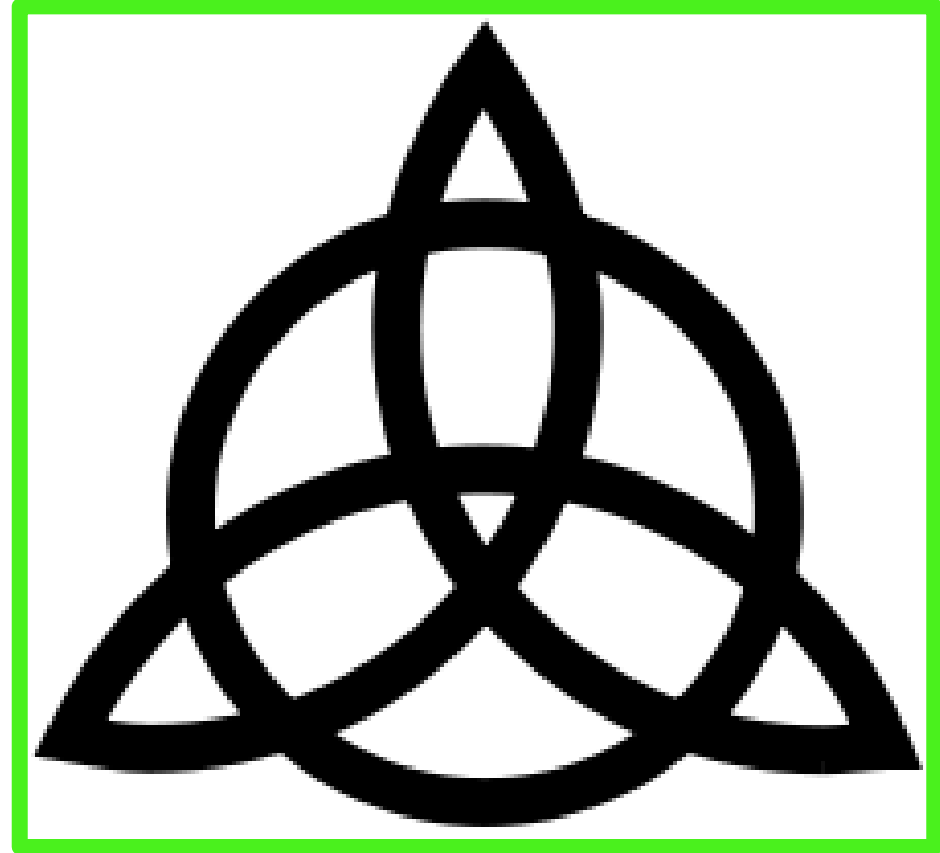


Ratio of New AOBNMM Certifications to Graduates of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine

- Speak up. Take positive action.



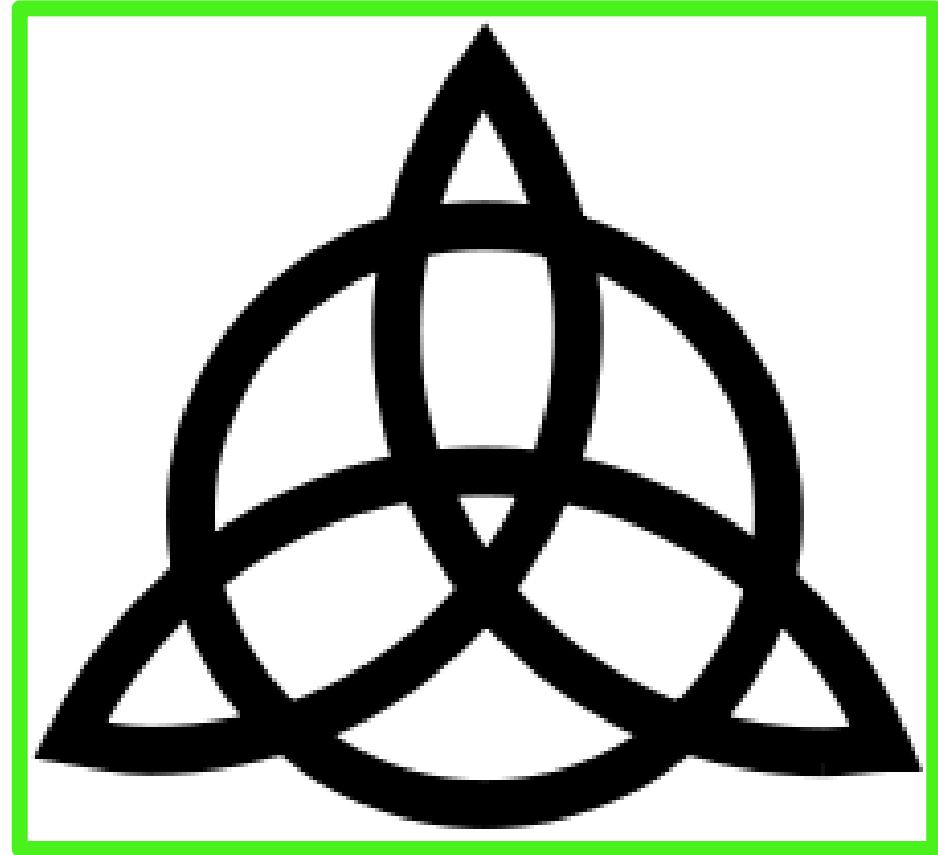
The Power of One
