# Exploring the Tide

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

This intermediate course in osteopathic diagnosis and treatment presents information and palpatory experience that heretofore has not been available through colleges of osteopathic medicine or other teaching venues. It is the product of the clinical experience of R. Paul Lee, DO, FAAO, FCA, DABMA. We will explore how the whole of the body expresses interrelationships through the fascia and how treating one part of the body influences and is influenced by other parts. Those who have taken a percussion hammer course will recognize the relationships we teach in this course, but without the vibrator.

One full day will be spent on a subject that revolutionized and drove Dr. Lee's clinical and personal life – querying the tide for its ultimate intelligence. It informs the physician on what anatomic part am I palpating, what do I do next in this case, or what's good for me to eat?

Then, we will learn how to treat inflammation in the body by downregulating the seven neurological centers of the Central Autonomic Network in the brain, a most useful technique. We will learn how the brain is a dynamo and how this informs our understanding of a CV4. Finally, we will learn how to work on the traumatized brain.

This course takes the student from familiar territory and structural clues to less familiar ground in treating energetic influences and the nervous system directly. This progression allows one who is not experienced in treating the brain to become capable. But from the beginning,

Students of this course will have the opportunity to learn:

### Learning Objectives

1. How the Tide of primary respiration represents Health and can be practically utilized in biomechanical osteopathic diagnosis and treatment.
2. How various osteopathic techniques improve function of the whole body through releasing fascial restrictions at many separate, but connected locations.
3. How to perceive a pathological fulcrum and watch it normalize into a physiological fulcrum.
4. How to simultaneously use two hands doing independent BLT and then energetically connect the two hands to release dysfunction between them.
5. How to effectively feel dysfunction at a distance.
6. How to utilize poorly recognized anatomical realities in osteopathic diagnosis and treatment that advance the patient's health.
7. How to incorporate new osteopathic manipulative techniques into the armamentarium of the osteopathic physician.

### DAY 2

8. How to consistently, effectively, and reliably query the Tide, an expression of the ultimate Intelligence, for its affirmative (fluctuation) or negative (no fluctuation) responses to diagnostic statements the operator silently poses.

9. How to utilize the Master Brain Point to determine the status of the autonomies, empower the immune system, and access the potency of the Tide.

10. How to utilize hand modes for diagnosis.

11. How to treat sympathetic chain ganglia and prevertebral ganglia.

12. How to treat Miasms.

13. How to utilize Contact Reflex Analysis in diagnosis.

14. How to determine priority of dysfunctions in joints, organs, and energetic fields.

15. How to treat energetic fields of shock, force vectors, and fulcra.

16. How to abort an incipient acute viral infection.

17. How to locate Sutherland's Fulcrum.

18. How to discern the motion of the cerebellum.

19. How to stimulate the parasympathetic activity of the vagus.

20. How to treat a cerebellar and a thalamic twist.


